



METHOD AND BASIS OF LEVIED BIA ASSESSMENTS

The Business District serves both a Property and Business Improvement District (PBID) and a Business Improvement Area. Assessments for properties in the PBID are based on parcel size, frontage, square footage, and zone. Assessments for businesses in the Business Improvement Area (BIA) for Fiscal Year 2022/2023 are calculated based on the following formula:

Retail

\$71 minimum to a maximum of \$728

Retail businesses include any business that sells goods such as auto parts, clothes, food, hardware and specialty items. In these cases, a business's gross sales and receipts would be multiplied by \$.000535. For example, if a business's gross annual sales are \$200,000, its annual BIA assessment would be \$107.


Non-Retail

\$71 flat rate.

Non-retail businesses include professionals and service-oriented businesses such as an accountant, architect, attorney, engineer, dentist or doctor.








Carruchas y Café

Carruchas y Café is a community event introduced in 2023 by the Franklin Boulevard Business District in collaboration with Capital Style Car Club and Sacramento Car Club. On every 3rd Sunday of the month we activate the Boulevard with local vendors, beautiful cars, and nostalgic music. Continuing the legacy of Franklin Blvd.'s ties to the Lowriding community, Carruchas y Café brings families and the Lowriding culture together. Within the first year of these events, many car enthusiasts from northern California have participated every month. We look forward to continuing another great summer of Carruchas y Café for the upcoming year of 2024.

Back to the Boulevard

Back to the Boulevard returned in 2022 and even the rain could not stop it. The annual Show and Shine/Cruise event covers a 1.2 mile stretch of Franklin Blvd. from 12th Ave to Fruitridge Rd. With over 400 + cars, 60 + vendors, a dignitary parade, cultural and historical events, boxing, musical acts and more. The flavor and personality of the District and community is on full display as over 15,000 attendees make their way through the district each September.



National Night Out

With over 1,000 attendees, National Night Out (NNO) is an anticipated event for the PBID as we showcase local law enforcement's relationship with the District and North City Farms community. It promotes not only our relationship with local law enforcement agencies such as, Sacramento Police Department (SPD), Sacramento County Sheriff Department (SCSD), and California Highway Patrol (CHP), but strives to bring back a true sense of community. Held every year on the 1st Tuesday in August, this free giveaway event is a staple for our District.

FRANKLIN BLVD COMPLETE STREET

The Franklin Boulevard Complete Street project is continuing to move forward. The project will transform Franklin Blvd. from Sutterville Rd./12th Ave. to 38th Ave. into a safer and more comfortable street for people to drive, bike, walk, or roll, and a more attractive commercial corridor for businesses and new investment. The City of Sacramento is working with the Franklin Boulevard Business Association on final design for the Sutterville Rd to 32nd Avenue segment, with construction expected to begin in 2024. The City was also awarded nearly \$1.6 million in state Active Transportation Program funds for final design of the segment from 32nd to 38th Avenues, which will complete the project. Future construction of that section will complete the project.

SELF-HELP CREDIT UNION

The Association has been working with Branch Manager, Julio Ortiz and Self-Help Federal Credit Union for years to bring community-minded financial banking back to the boulevard. Beginning with the loss of our major employer Campbell's Soup in 2007, and the closure of our only financial institution shortly thereafter, our community has been underserved in access to banking for nearly two decades. We are absolutely thrilled to have this resource in our district and look forward to an ongoing partnership with Self-Help Federal Credit Union.



FRANKLIN NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Clean California Grant

The Franklin Neighborhood Development Corporation (FNDC) and City of Sacramento have been partnering on a Caltrans Clean California grant to help create a more welcoming environment along a key walking route between South Oak Park, North City Farms, and the Franklin District, to and from Ethel Phillips Elementary School, and to help reconnect these neighborhoods that were cut off by the construction of Highway 99 in the 1960s. The project includes sidewalk and street improvements, murals, sculptures, and utility box wraps. These projects will be completed in June 2024.





Community involvement was the connecting thread throughout this mural project. It was important for the design to be inspired by the surrounding neighborhoods, the stories, and the cultural influences. Reuniting both sides of the underpass in a community paint day was the highlight of this project. Families and neighbors coming together to make their mark on the wall was an infusion of positive energy. Transforming this gateway was an incredible collaborative effort and I'm honored to have played a key part in 21st

Karen Sue & Ethel Phillips Elementary

In March of 2023, Artist Karen Chen, of Karen Sue Studios began the mural project for Ethel Phillips Elementary School. The mural embodies the beautiful cultures that represent Ethel Phillips students. By May of 2023, over 450 students were able to enjoy a day of art and paint their new mural.

Since a large number of the students are of Mexican heritage, the mural's representation is of a Quetzalcoatl (a feathered serpent) and dahlia's, the Mexican national flower. The artist chose a yellow dahlia as they symbolize friendship. Karen also included a lotus flower from her own Taiwanese heritage. "The lotus flower is special in many cultures because it can grow in dirty and muddy water. It reminds us that even when things are difficult, we can still stay kind and strong." Karen Sue





EMPRENDE ENTREPRENEURSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

In partnership with the Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce



The Emprende Program (formerly known as the Micro Empresario Program) was created in 2019, and now operates in partnership with the Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce. This 10-week course offers Spanish-speaking entrepreneurs an opportunity to learn, inlanguage, from Latinx business professionals on how to start a business from concept to implementation and continues to be a pillar program of the FNDC.

Since 2021, we have partnered with the Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (SHCC) to grow our Micro-enterprise program into a program that supports entrepreneurs from the City and County of Sacramento, and beyond. Our partnership with SHCC continues to increase our capacity to provide technical assistance and access to other programs for our minority entrepreneurs, while offering them the help they need to thrive in small business ownership.

Since 2019, we have graduated 100 minority entrepreneurs and are currently running our 10th cohort in a hybrid model. We will continue this work with our 11th cohort beginning in the fall of 2024.


